

The MMR vaccine protects against:

- <u>measles</u>
- <u>mumps</u>
- rubella (german measles)

These 3 infections spread easily between people and can lead to serious

problems including meningitis, blindness and hearing loss.

If you're pregnant, getting measles can cause premature birth,

Miscarriage or still birth. And getting rubella can cause serious problems

for your baby such as damage to their sight and hearing.

2 doses of the MMR vaccine gives you long-term protection.

Getting vaccinated also helps protect people who cannot be vaccinated,

such as unborn babies, newborn babies and anyone with weakened

immune system.
